### Question

### Correct

Because their political affiliation can damage the bank's reputation.

Because these clients generally have bank accounts with considerable balances, making tax evasion and money-laundering practices plausible.


Because these clients are more susceptible to blackmail, corruption and money-laundering practices due to their position and influence.


We call these clients 'PEPs' (politically exposed persons). Due to his or her position and influence, a PEP is more susceptible to blackmail, corruption and money-laundering practices. For this reason, closer scrutiny is required. In addition, a PEP must be reviewed periodically.
